Long overshadowed, the Central Coast now speaks with a united voice on the issues shaping our future. Long underfunded, the region is now better positioned to attract public and private investment, with significant resources already flowing. Long underperforming, our economy is gaining new momentum in fast-growing global industries.

HERE'S HOW WE DO IT:

Building Regional Muscle

has united businesses, civic leaders, and communities to align efforts and tackle shared challenges. Action teams and industry councils have provided critical insights, while roundtables have brought the region's city and county officials together to collaborate on shared priorities. Economic development networks have connected cities, chambers, and organizations to retain, attract, and expand businesses. Partnerships in aerospace and energy are driving innovation and job creation, supported by the region's first-ever unified economic strategy. This strategy aligns San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties with state and federal priorities, creating a roadmap for longterm competitiveness.

Fueling Data + Analysis

has empowered smarter decisions and strategies. Through partnerships with the Brookings Institution, Deloitte, and others, we've surfaced insights into industry growth, workforce needs, and opportunities. Tools like the REACH Data Center make this data accessible to policymakers, businesses, and community leaders, enabling informed action.

Fostering Inclusive, Cross-Regional Partnerships

has ensured that progress reflects the voices of the entire region. As a broker of solutions, REACH brings together diverse voices—from labor and industry to government and community groups—to ensure initiatives represent the full spectrum of regional needs. By fostering alignment and compromise, we unlock progress on the systemic challenges holding the region back. Collaborative governance frameworks, including advisory councils, steering committees, and active MOU partnerships, have brought together a cross-sector approach that ensures that initiatives and projects are deeply informed by the needs and priorities of the region's communities.

Raising the Central Coast's Profile

has positioned the region as a location for innovation and opportunity. By showcasing strengths at global events like the Space Symposium and Select USA Summit, the region has attracted attention, talent, and investment. Recognition from national organizations has further cemented the Central Coast's reputation as a hub for business and innovation.

Strengthening State + Federal Connections

has amplified the Central Coast's voice on the national stage. Through advocacy and collaboration, the region has secured millions in funding for transformative projects in industries like space and energy. Engagement with state and federal leaders has elevated regional priorities, while partnerships with agencies have boosted competitiveness for critical funding and resources.

The work to date has catalyzed real progress, but it is only the beginning.

Meeting the challenges ahead will require deeper collaboration, bold action, and a sustained commitment to building a thriving, inclusive future for the Central Coast.

Elevating Regional Impact

REACH is also at the helm of a bold new initiative, working alongside the state, the Economic Development Collaborative, and the Monterey Bay Economic Partnership to foster economic resilience and elevate the quality of life for more than 2 million people across six counties.

This groundbreaking collaboration showcases the strength of regional alignment with the state, already securing \$19 million for the region under the California Jobs First program—with the potential for millions more. This investment fueled unprecedented, inclusive outreach engaging thousands of voices in shaping economic strategies aimed at uplifting the entire region.

With \$9 million to seed community-driven projects that will strengthen the future for our region and its residents, the coalition is also advancing broad-based strategies to boost quality job creation and economic mobility. Core among the job creation strategies is capitalizing on the region's strengths in precision manufacturing and advanced business services, spanning sectors across aerospace, advanced air mobility, and microelectronics.

This is more than a partnership; it's a unified movement. By aligning regional and state priorities, we're unlocking the Central Coast's potential and proving what's possible through collaboration and shared vision.



Everything is Connected

The ecosystem of opportunity depends on connected efforts for collective impact. Education shapes the workforce. Housing supports the community. Jobs power the economy. 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

We Stand at a Crossroads

The Central Coast economy is at a critical juncture marked by both promising opportunities and sobering challenges. On one path lies a future of innovation, prosperity, and inclusion, where the next generation and beyond can live, work, and thrive. On the other path, complacency risks a future of mediocrity, where only the wealthy and short-term residents can afford to live.

Our region has experienced job growth and rising earnings over the past decade, but the gains fall short of state and national benchmarks, signaling an underperforming economy. The cost of living—especially skyrocketing housing prices—places tremendous strain on our workforce. Nearly half of the region's population belongs to families struggling to make ends meet, with children disproportionately impacted. Without bold action, these affordability challenges will further erode our communities, forcing more workers, families, and businesses to leave.

Doing nothing is a choice. And that choice comes with consequences. Growing companies will relocate to regions better equipped to support them. Young people will seek opportunities elsewhere, leaving

behind communities unable to sustain vibrant, diverse economies. The Central Coast could become a region defined by extremes: a destination for retirees, transient students, and tourists, but unable to provide lasting opportunities for the people who live and work here.


Yet there is another path—a path of promise. This region is home to exceptional research and innovation capacity, far outpacing state and national averages. Industries like aerospace, high tech, and clean energy are poised to drive global growth, bringing high—paying jobs and new wealth into the region. These bright spots present a transformative opportunity, but only if we act decisively.

We can choose to strengthen these globally connected industries, ensuring they provide onramps for local residents to access the high-quality jobs they offer. We can tackle the persistent barrier of housing affordability, creating homes that workers and families can afford. We can align education and workforce systems with industry needs, giving our people the skills to succeed in a rapidly evolving economy.

This is not just about economic growth—it's about economic mobility. It's about creating a Central Coast where everyone has the opportunity to thrive, not just a select few. The decisions we make today will determine whether we seize this moment or let it slip through our fingers.

Two futures lie ahead. One where we shape a thriving, equitable economy—and one where opportunity continues to drift away. Will we meet this moment, or let it pass us by?




Why Good-Paying Jobs?

Good-paying jobs are the backbone of economic mobility and regional prosperity. Defined as roles with annual wages of \$62,000 or more, this updated benchmark reflects inflation adjustments, ensuring a focus on financial stability in today's evolving economy.

These jobs are more than a paycheck—they provide financial security, allowing families to build long-term stability. They offer career mobility, opening pathways for skill-building and advancement, while enhancing regional competitiveness by attracting and retaining talent that fuels local industries and innovation.

The ripple effects of good-paying jobs extend across the Central Coast. They sustain community vitality, as higher wages boost local businesses, housing markets, and essential services.

Focusing on good-paying jobs builds a future where opportunities are shared broadly, industries thrive, and families flourish. These roles are the foundation for sustainable, inclusive growth that ensures the prosperity of the Central Coast for generations to come.







A Focus on Precision Manufacturing

A bedrock of regional competitiveness and stepping stone to economic mobility

Encompassing advanced and micro-scale manufacturing techniques, precision manufacturing is vital to the Central Coast's economy, underpinning and feeding the region's aerospace, agtech, high tech and clean energy industries.

Also identified as a priority by the six-county Uplift Central Coast collaboration, precision manufacturing offers accessible, good-paying career opportunities that don't require a four-year degree.

This rapidly growing wrap-around field provides pathways to economic mobility through jobs that often pay above the median wage, while powering regional innovation and meeting workforce demands in high-growth sectors. With its cross-cutting applications, precision manufacturing strengthens the region's globally competitive industries, ensuring the Central Coast remains a hub of innovation, opportunity, and prosperity.

INNOVATION INDUSTRIES

Space + Aerospace

22

Centered around Vandenberg Space Force Base, this sector encompasses satellite launches, space exploration, and advanced air mobility innovations.

Why it matters: Vandenberg Space Force Base powers approximately 16,000 jobs in Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties.

Cleantech + Energy

Focuses on renewable energy sources, including offshore wind development and advanced energy technologies addressing sustainability and environmental goals.

Why it matters: The clean technology sector is a growing area with potential to power millions of homes and create a robust supply chain.

High Tech

Involves research and development in microelectronics, quantum computing, and artificial intelligence, leveraging regional academic institutions.

Why it matters: The technology sector is a significant contributor to the region's economy, with a focus on innovation and high-quality jobs.

ANCHOR INDUSTRIES

Ag + Agtech

With deep roots in the region, this sector spans traditional farming and cutting-edge technologies like precision agriculture and automation.

Why it matters: Ag innovation presents the opportunity to increase job quality and salaries in one of the region's largest expanding industries.

Healthcare

Provides medical services, research, and development in biotechnology, meeting the healthcare needs of the growing population.

Why it matters: Healthcare is among the largest employment sectors, offering numerous skilled job opportunities.

Building Design + Construction

Involves architectural design, engineering, and construction services, contributing to infrastructure development and urban planning.

Why it matters: The construction industry plays a vital role in regional development, providing numerous employment opportunities.

Spur Entrepreneurship + Business Expansion

From all things tech to healthcare and building design and construction, our regional economy spans established and emerging industries with the potential to create thousands of new good-paying jobs

Our regional economy has a lot going for it. A diversity of businesses competing and thriving in global markets. Enviable education and innovation assets. An energetic spirit of community and entrepreneurship nurturing startups and scaleups.

Through targeted steps to better connect and strengthen these foundations, our region can spur the creation of thousands of new good-paying jobs and firmly establish the Central Coast as a place where innovation, startups and homegrown companies flourish.

Together with a network of partners, we've made impactful progress on enhancing and integrating a range of business startup, attraction and expansion efforts across the region. Our focus is sharpening on growing from within: connecting the businesses in our community to the resources they need to grow, bolstering the inventory of expansion-ready sites, and expanding existing programs and facilities to create a connected regional entrepreneurial ecosystem.

Research and analysis on our key industries underscores what we've learned working with companies in the region—they are ripe for growth. By supporting business needs on a regional scale, we can collectively unleash that growth as an engine for more high-paying jobs for our residents.

- + Catalytic public investment in economic development. All levels of government must prioritize investment in the infrastructure, education, workforce development and other building blocks of economic growth, a cornerstone of our advocacy and collaboration with government partners.
- + Regional commitment to collaboration over competition.

 Combining our collective strengths, assets and efforts across jurisdictions, community segments and political aisles is the only way our region will reach the goal of greater economic prosperity. Galvanizing and stewarding this regional mindset and commitment is a core part of the REACH mission.
- + Streamlined government processes. Clarity and certainty in gaining permitting approval and utility service are needed to attract private-sector investment in the buildings and infrastructure to support industry growth. We advocate widely for these improvements.

Launch Space + Aerospace


Home to one of the nation's primary space launch sites and a rich air and space legacy, the Central Coast is a competitive frontier for space and advanced air-mobility innovation

The REACH 2030 ambition of building a thriving space enterprise at Vandenberg Space Force Base has become reality. Vandenberg is now the second-busiest spaceport in the world, with major launch providers rapidly expanding operations, injecting millions of dollars in new investment in the region, and hiring hundreds of Central Coast residents. And our sights have widened to encompass the full universe of aerospace and emerging fields like advanced air mobility and horizontal space launch.

It's an industry with a 100-year legacy on the Central Coast, and one that holds great promise for our future. The global space economy is projected to surpass \$1 trillion by 2040, nearly double its value today, while the next-gen urban aircraft and drones of the advanced air mobility sector are projected to soar four-fold to over \$40 billion in just 5 years.

Cutting-edge companies developing satellites, drones and electric air taxis and designing and building the components and systems behind space missions are expanding across the Central Coast. Forging the future of transportation, connectivity, scientific discovery and global challenges like climate resiliency, these companies also provide wide avenues into high-quality jobs that pay well above the region's median wage.

By continuing to pair bold vision with strategic action and broad collaboration, we are establishing the region as a center of gravity shaping the future of these industries, employing thousands of Central Coast residents, and inspiring the next generation to look to the skies and dream big.

WHAT WE'RE DOING

- + Attract and expand space + aerospace companies by actively engaging with companies in the sector, showcasing the region's ecosystem and advantages, and providing concierge expansion and location support

Met with forward-looking vision and nimble urgency, the region has never been better positioned to capitalize on our distinctive assets and expertise to ensure that this industry remains a core driver of the Central Coast economy.

Diablo Canyon was still slated to close when REACH 2030 was released in 2020. Now it's at the forefront of energy transformation nationwide, with a vision to establish a hub of clean energy and climate innovation already gaining traction. Global companies and local startups pursuing cutting-edge new energy technologies in fusion, floating offshore wind and beyond are expanding and rooting down in the region.

Rising demand and ambitious clean energy targets are fueling historic levels of investment in research, development and deployment worldwide. Global clean energy investment reached \$1.7 trillion in 2023, overtaking fossil fuel investment for the first time. The U.S. set new targets to triple nuclear energy capacity by 2050, and California remains a global leader in clean energy, on track to achieve 100% carbon–free electricity by 2045.

Between new technology breakthroughs, shifting policies and evolving market demands, the energy landscape is likely to remain fluid in coming years. By remaining proactive in planning and adaptable in execution, we are positioning the region to capture emerging opportunities and sustain our role as a leader in energy and climate resiliency.

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Power the Future of High Tech

The Central Coast has long played a big role in developing leading-edge tech, an area ripe for inclusive job growth

The microelectronics that power modern life are being pioneered right here on the Central Coast. Chips and semiconductors, lasers and photonics, autonomous systems and quantum computing—our region is at the global forefront of technological innovation.

These fields require more than university lab breakthroughs and startup ingenuity. They need highly specialized equipment and clean-room facilities. They need trained technicians to fabricate and assemble micro- and nano-scale components. By delivering these essential resources, we can ensure that the technologies developed here remain anchored in the region, driving economic growth and creating good-paying jobs accessible to workers without a four-year degree.

The scale of opportunity is immense, driven by skyrocketing global demand for consumer electronics, advances in autonomous vehicles, and the proliferation of AI applications.

The semiconductor market alone is projected to grow from \$600 million to over \$2 trillion by 2032, while quantum computing is about to quadruple its market size from just a few years ago. Collectively, these fields represent a substantial portion of the global technology market, with combined valuations reaching well into the trillions of dollars.

These are the technologies shaping the future of our world, and we can harness the region's trailblazing assets and innovation ecosystem to also shape a more inclusive future for the Central Coast and its people.


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EMPOWER PEOPLE WITH ACCESSIBLE CAREER PATHS

This approach ensures we retain talent from our universities and nurture a skilled workforce from the ground up.
- + Expanded availability and accessibility of quality education and training opportunities. The Central Coast simply doesn't have enough degree, apprenticeship and certification programs to meet the needs of its residents. We are supporting a range of efforts to increase both options and access to associate, bachelors and advanced degrees as well as the career technical training needed to expand the skills and talent of the workforce.
- + Widespread adoption of skills-based hiring to reduce barriers.

 Traditional hiring practices and other systemic barriers can unintentionally exclude qualified candidates. We are working to champion more equitable hiring practices and expand opportunities for the region's diverse workforce.



ENABLE HOUSING FOR THE REGION'S WORKFORCE

A Community Imperative

Our first 5 years have reinforced again and again that the lack of housing affordable to workers is the single biggest barrier to job creation—and as a result, economic mobility and resilience region—wide. Businesses can't hire and workers can't afford to live here.

As we enter our next 5 years, we are elevating our focus on this fundamental threat to our economy and way of life—bringing new urgency to collaboration across business, government, nonprofits and education to enable a range of housing options so that workers, and families can put down roots and both contribute to and benefit from our shared future.



Housing the workforce is a key building block of economic activity and job growth, as well as a thriving community and desirable quality of life.

And yet regional housing production has not kept pace with community needs, leading to a gap that has fueled the Central Coast's affordability crisis and eroded economic resilience.

On the bright side, recent years have seen some progress. Increasing regional recognition of the dire consequences of inaction has sparked fresh momentum. Local governments, builders and employers are exploring new approaches, from targeted programs to get people into homes to encouraging more multifamily housing development. The state has added new tools to the toolbox, including streamlined approval processes, zoning reforms, density bonuses, and incentives to build housing on surplus government land. New building projects are moving through the pipeline.

There's a long way yet to go. But by embracing these solutions in a systematic and collaborative way, our region can enable the housing our families, workforce and economy desperately need.

A healthy housing supply includes a diversity of housing types across income types.



WHAT WE'RE DOING

- + Spur regional coalitions to advance a range of housing options by leading and/or supporting efforts to unite community stakeholders around important workforce housing projects
- + Secure investment in critical supporting infrastructure by collaborating with jurisdictions and developers to prioritize and spur funding for infrastructure—such as roads, water, sewer, and broadband—that enables cost-effective home construction
- + Expand programs enabling the workforce to access homes by exploring opportunities to launch or scale programs such as down payment assistance and employer-sponsored housing
- + Launch pilot program to redevelop surplus public property by partnering with school districts and public agencies to develop a portfolio of opportunities to build housing on underutilized property
- + Cultivate private-sector leadership and collaboration with public sector by regularly convening a Building Design and Construction industry council to identify trends, share best practices, and pursue innovative solutions
- + Map and track workforce housing opportunities by maintaining a real-time dashboard of proposed and potential projects to support advocacy and investment

SYSTEM CHANGES

- + A culture of regional collaboration on housing and infrastructure planning and investment. A regional mindset is essential for identifying and advancing the most impactful opportunities to address housing needs. We are fostering the interagency planning, funding coordination, cross-sector engagement, and data-driven analysis needed to align efforts and resources.
- + Increased certainty and speed in the housing project approval process. Clear, predictable, and efficient timelines and requirements are critical to spurring private-sector investment in housing. We are engaging across the spectrum of stakeholders to champion best practices, streamline processes, and strengthen public-private collaboration to reduce delays and unlock housing development.
- + Adoption of new policy tools to unlock potential housing. Proactive land use, zoning reforms, creative funding mechanisms, and other policy innovations can create new opportunities to expand housing. As communities plan for future growth, we are advocating for evaluation and adoption of the strategies with the greatest potential for our region.

Measuring What Matters for a Thriving Central Coast

When REACH set an ambitious goal of creating 15,000 good-paying jobs by 2030, it wasn't just about hitting a number. It was about transforming the Central Coast into a place where opportunity abounds — where every resident has a real chance to build a career, grow their family, and afford a place to call home. We're proud of the progress made so far, with thousands of jobs created and in the pipeline.

For those jobs to truly take root, however, we need to ensure the region is ready to support the people who will fill them. That's why we're taking a holistic approach to measuring the region's readiness to create economic opportunity and mobility. Each metric reflects a part of the bigger story: good-paying jobs that come with pathways to success, housing that keeps workers and families grounded in the region, and an ecosystem that nurtures ideas and talents.

These metrics represent the health of the major factors that impact our region's ability to create jobs and drive economic opportunity. While there's much we can't control, tracking these measures helps us understand trends and adjust our efforts, providing a critical foundation for shaping strategies that deliver meaningful change.



What We're Tracking and Why It Matters

At the center of this effort is the 15,000 good-paying jobs goal, supported by key inputs across the ecosystem:

01. Jobs + Innovation

- Economic Mobility: Median household income, segmented by race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status, shows whether economic growth is translating into meaningful financial progress for all residents.
- + **Innovation Capacity:** Tracking patents, research articles and R&D investment per capita highlights the region's competitiveness in driving technological advancements and attracting business investment.
- + **Entrepreneurial Startups:** Measuring venture capital funding and jobs created through startups and expansion reveals how well the region fosters economic dynamism and innovation.

02. People

- + **Educational Attainment:** High school graduation rates and the percentage of the population with bachelors, associate's degrees, and certifications reveal how well the region is preparing its workforce for good-paying jobs and long-term career success.
- + **Inclusive Talent Pipeline Alignment:** Tracking degrees and certifications awarded in relevant fields, open positions in target industries, and participation of underrepresented groups in career pathways ensures education and workforce systems align with industry needs and provide equitable access to opportunities.

03. Housing

- + **Housing Affordability:** Median rent costs, home prices, and the share of cost-burdened households spending more than 30% of income on housing indicate whether workers and families can afford to live in the region—a critical factor in retaining talent.
- + **Housing Supply:** The number of building permits issued, RHNA housing target data, and segmentation by housing type and affordability level show whether the region is meeting the demand for diverse and affordable housing options.

These metrics help ensure that the benefits of economic growth are widely shared, accessible, and aligned with the conditions needed for success. They are not static; they will evolve as new initiatives emerge and new insights shape our work.
